Directions:

From Junction 49 on the A1 follow signs to Thirsk/Teeside on to A168/A19.

Once on the A19 dual carriageway, go past the junctions for Thirsk and Northallerton and turn off at the junction marked "Knayton/Borrowby" (NB the turning comes up quickly after the signpost).

Follow the road round to the crossroads and turn sharp right, crossing the A19 into Knayton.

Drive straight on past the Dog and Gun pub and through the village.

Approximately ½ mile out of the village go straight across the cross roads on to a road marked “single track with passing spaces”.

Old Low Moor Farm is the first farm on your left. Go past the entrance marked with the millstone and turn left into the second, stoned driveway leading up to the Stables with the fishing lake to your right. You will find parking spaces in the second bay at the rear of the detached barn.

The holiday let will be open with the keys on the inside so you can go in and make yourself at home, we will catch up with you at some point. If you have any issues then please contact us (details at the front).

NB If you use a satnav it will probably take you further down Moor Road, past the farm.

General Information:

We supply towels, soaps, shower gel, shampoo and conditioner etc.

We also provide an initial supply of tea, coffee (including a supply of capsules for the Nespresso machine) and sugar to get you started. Condiments and kitchen essentials such as washing up liquid, dishwasher tablets, cling film, foil, washing up cloths, tea towels and oven gloves are also supplied.

If you wish to arrange a delivery of groceries before you arrive we would be happy to receive and unpack it for you ready for your arrival, just give us a call to arrange a delivery time, please ask the supermarket to deliver to the second entrance.

Heating to the property is via underfloor heating on the ground floor controlled by a thermostat on the sitting room wall next to the TV. Please remember that underfloor heating takes time to react to changes in settings. There are radiators to the first floor, controllable by thermostats on the radiators and a heated towel warmer in the bathroom.

*There is free Wi Fi in the Granary the network is listed under “The Granary” and the password is: **milton123**. Unfortunately Superfast Wi-Fi is not yet available in our area and our present connection may not allow you to stream films etc. from mobile phones or other devices.*

There is a table and seating outside on the patio by the front door and a barbecue is available for your use, we provide an initial supply of charcoal, firelighters and matches. There is bench seating available on the patio in the Courtyard. Shaded seating is also available under the trees beside the tennis court.

You are welcome to use the tennis court, we have some tennis racquets and balls located in the chest just inside the tennis court) which you are welcome to use but if you are a serious player we advise you to bring your own!

We have a small coarse fishing lake in the field next to the Mistal which is available for use by guests free of charge. The lake is 8 feet deep in the middle and has steep sides so please ensure children do not go near it unless accompanied by an adult. The lake

is well stocked with barbel, roach, bream, tench, F1 and crucian carp. We can lend you a fishing rod if you do not want to bring your own gear.

Stabling and grazing is available for guests own horse/s by prior arrangement and at extra cost, please contact us for further details. There is also a ménage which you are welcome to use. Unfortunately our insurers will not permit us to offer riding lessons for guests.

There is a golf course in Thirsk which is open to visitors.

Dogs

Well behaved dogs are welcome, again by prior arrangement with us (limited to two small dogs or one medium/large dog in the Granary please). We ask you not to allow dogs upstairs or on the sofas. The staircase in the Granary is an open tread wood staircase and this can be a hazard to dogs, if you are worried about this please ask us to fit a stair gate to prevent your dog going upstairs and potentially injuring itself. Please do not wash your dog in the bath, there is a hosepipe on the wall opposite the patio in front of the Mistal which you are welcome to use. If you need dog towels please ask as we have plenty. You are welcome to walk around our fields but please keep dogs under control and on a lead if there are horses or other livestock in the fields.

Waste and recycling

There is a bin for general waste in the kitchen and recycling bins are located to the side of the Granary, by the fire escape. There is one bin for general non-recyclable waste, two bins for general recycling which includes paper and cardboard, plastic trays and containers (other than black plastic which is not recycled here) and tins and a separate bin for glass bottles and jars. Please take care in putting glass in the glass bin as the recycling company will not take broken glass.

*We are not connected to mains sewerage and have our own waste treatment plant. **Please do not put anything down the toilets apart from human waste and toilet paper.** Covered bins are available in each bathroom for other items such as face wipes, sanitary products etc.*

Laundry

*We have a guest laundry located in the Courtyard with washing machine and tumble drier available for use by guests. Please ask us for the keys if you wish to use it. **Please note that it is not to be used before 9.00am or after 6.00pm to avoid disturbing other guests in the Byre or Shippen.***

Cleaning Equipment

Cordless Hoover, Anti-static Brush and Iron/Ironing board is in the cupboard next to the front door, Please make sure the hoover is charging when put back.

There is Mop & Bucket in the Laundry Room, Please return after use for other guests.

Health and Safety

Our fire risk assessment can be found in our information folder, which you are advised to read. Please note that the windows on the first floor are too small to escape easily through in the event of a fire but there is a fire escape operated by a push bar leading down steps to the side of the Granary. There is a fire blanket on the side of the oven housing and a fire extinguisher in the cupboard under the sink.

The staircase in the Granary can be slippery in bare or stocking feet, please be careful on it. Similarly the bath can be slippery especially if shower gels etc. are used and so please use the plastic mats provided.

There is a low beam in the Granary bedroom approximately 5ft 11 inches from the floor and so persons over that height will need to duck under it, warning signs are displayed on both sides of the beam.

The lake is deep (8ft in the centre) but any water can be a hazard to young children who should not be left unattended near the lake or our fish pond.

Children using the playground must be supervised at all times by an adult.

Our horses are generally friendly but all animals can be unpredictable and although you are welcome to visit the stables and the horses please be wary at all times and do not stand immediately behind them or where they might accidentally stand on your feet.

Around and about

The farm is located just a couple of miles from the North York Moors National Park but there is also easy access to the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

Thirsk is approximately 4 miles away and has a variety of shops, cafes and restaurants. The county town of Northallerton is approximately 5 miles away and as well as more shops, cafes and restaurants, it has a branch of the famous Betty's Tea Shop. Market days for Thirsk are Saturdays and Mondays and for Northallerton are Saturdays and Wednesdays.

York is around 35 minutes away by car or 20 mins by train from Thirsk, Harrogate is around 40 minutes by car. The North York coast with Whitby, Robin Hoods Bay and Scarborough are around 1¼ hours away by car.

Eating out

There are many excellent eating out places within easy reach, the closest pub/restaurant to the property is **The Dog and Gun** in Knayton (within walking distance, very popular with excellent home cooked food but it is advisable to book in well in advance, tel. 01845 537368, often before your visit!). The Dog and Gun is closed on Mondays and does not serve food on Tuesdays but is open for food each evening Wednesday to Saturday and on Sundays from 12.00 noon to 6.00pm.

In or near Thirsk there is:

The Carpenters Arms at Felixkirk (lovely old pub with stunning views from their terrace over the Vale of York, tel. 01845 537369)

The Old Oak Tree (tel 01845 523276 located in South Kilvington on the road into Thirsk - good range of menu with popular pub type food, booking recommended)

Grayhound at Bagby (tel 01845 591433 Just off the A19 on the way to York left hand side follow signs to Bagby)

Bianco Ristorante (tel 01904 405412 Thirsk in the market place.

Angel Pub (tel 01845 578000 in the main street of Topcliffe)

The Golden Fleece Hotel (tel 01845 523108- in the market place in Thirsk, newly refurbished and re-opened, booking recommended)

The Three Tuns (tel 01845 524605- again in the market place in Thirsk, busy Wetherspoons pub/restaurant no need to book usually)

The Crosby (tel 0800 047 6892- in Thornton le Beans en route to Northallerton, good food, very reasonably priced)

These are just a selection of local places to eat but we would be happy to suggest other places in nearby villages/towns.

No smoking

We have a strict no smoking policy in the house. Please do not use lighted candles in the house either.

When you leave

Our standard departure time is 10am, to enable us to get the property ready for any further guests by 3.00pm but if we do not have a booking immediately after you we can often be flexible about the departure time.

Please report any breakages to us and it is very helpful if you could leave the property as tidy as possible, strip any beds that you have used and leave used towels and bedding downstairs for us.
